Snow Removal

To ensure that you can have access to your property via your driveway, please do not shovel snow onto the streets. As Per Town of Hardisty Bylaw #1070, no snow from a sidewalk/driveway can be placed on the adjacent roadway.

By not shovelling or plowing or blowing you snow into the roads, you will keep the roads clear for longer. A large scale cleanout of the entire town recently took place, and to help everyone maintain the clear roads, please refrain from this action. Similarly, shovelling snow into back alleys will impede travel in those areas.

NEW CANADA'S GUIDANCE ON ALCOHOL & HEALTH! Just Released!

Canada's Guidance on Alcohol and Health provides people living in Canada with the information they need to make well-informed and responsible decisions about their alcohol consumption.

Key points from the guidance include:

There is a continuum of risk associated with weekly alcohol use where the risk of harm is:

- 0 drinks per week Not drinking has benefits, such as better health, and better sleep.
- 2 standard drinks or less per week You are likely to avoid alcoholrelated consequences for yourself or others at this level.
- 3–6 standard drinks per week Your risk of developing several types of cancer, including breast and colon cancer, increases at this level.
- 7 standard drinks or more per week Your risk of heart disease or stroke increases significantly at this level.
- Each additional standard drink radically increases the risk of alcoholrelated consequences.

Consuming more than 2 standard drinks per occasion is associated with an increased risk of harms to self and others, including injuries and violence.

When pregnant or trying to get pregnant, there is no known safe amount of alcohol use.

When breastfeeding, not drinking alcohol is safest.

No matter where you are on the continuum, for your health, less alcohol is better.

In this issue we will discuss customer responsibilities concerning services connected to their property.

Water Service:

From the main curb stop to inside the house or trailer is the responsibility of the property owner and all expenses associated with maintaining the service. This includes making sure that the shutoff valve near the meter is operational and does open and close if needed especially in an emergency. The town does replace the meter body or electronic head if needed from time to time due to age and wear. An exception to this is if the meter is frozen and damaged, depending on the repairs or replacement needed; the full cost of repairs is charged to the property owner. Meter bodies contain few working parts, one is a magnet that spins on a plastic turbine. This mechanism is calibrated by the manufacturer and tested so contrary to some opinions; it does not turn faster than other meters; although not impossible very rare. In the last seven years the public works department has never had a faulty reading meter. If you have a discrepancy with water usage, please remember a running toilet or leaky valve is more than just an annoyance, it is something that adds up over time. If the volume registered is after the meter, the leak will be somewhere in the property, not before it. You can google things like volumes for laundry, dishwashers, toilets, household capacity as in persons, showers , tubs, gardens , water softener regeneration, to give you an idea of how much water each of these can utilize. It doesn't take long for liters to add up.

Sewer Service:

A service can be affected by age of service, tree roots, cracks, and tenant issues like excess paper usage, pouring grease directly into the line, matted hair from showering or bathing, feminine hygiene products and a big culprit is cheaper laundry soap that doesn't totally dissolve and deposits in the line and builds up over time. Certain toilet papers are not very environmentally friendly contrary to what the commercials say. Just because the manufacturer says it's flushable, you take your chances doing it. The property owner is responsible under the municipal government act for any and all costs from the main line to inside the house. This includes what ever method is used to free the blockage in the line, be it snaking, power rooting, or having an company to come in and clear it. When you contact the Town, public works will immediately check for mainline issues or obstructions by inspecting manholes on both sides of the property. If we determine that the issue is in your service and not our main then the onus is on the property owner/tenant to remedy the situation accordingly. If it is determined to be a mainline issue, the town will fix the issue and remedy the situation.

Any questions concerning the above topics can be directed towards the office during office hours.

Special Note:

We will be notifying people who have had previous issues with frozen water lines in the near future. If your water pressure drops and the water turns dirty you should run the cold tap moderately open till it clears because often this is a sign of water freezing.

Spring is coming and hope everyone stays healthy and safe.
