

Keeping these tips and red flags in mind, homeowners can better protect them-selves and ensure they are working with reputable contractors.

- □ No licence or insurance
- ☐ High-pressure sales tactics
- □ Cash-only payments
- □ No written contract
- ☐ Lack of references
- ☐ Too-good-to-be-true pricing
- Unprofessional behaviour
- □ No online presence

Hiring A Contractor:

What You Need To Know

Things To Look Out For...

1. Check Licensing and Credentials

Ensure the contractor holds the necessary licenses and certifications required by your province or territory. You can verify this through your local municipal office or provincial regulatory body.

2. Ask for Insurance

Confirm that the contractor has valid liability insurance and workers' compensation coverage. This protects you from any potential damage or accidents that could occur during the project.

3. Get References and Read Reviews

Request references from recent projects and follow up with those clients to hear about their experiences. Additionally, look up online reviews on platforms like Google, Yelp, or the Better Business Bureau (BBB) to get a broader sense of the contractor's reputation.

4. Verify Business Information

Ensure the contractor has a physical business address and a landline phone number, not just a mobile number. A legitimate business should also have a GST/HST number and be registered with local business directories

5. Check for Membership in Professional Associations

Contractors who are members of profes-sional associations, such as the Canadian Home Builders' Association (CHBA) or other trade-specific organizations, are often held to higher standards and codes of conduct.

6. Request a Written Contract

A legitimate contractor will always provide a detailed written contract outlining the scope of work, timeline, materials, costs, and payment schedule. Avoid contractors who are unwilling to put the agreement in

7. Avoid Cash-Only Deals

Be cautious of contractors who request cash payments or offer discounts for pay-ing in cash. Legitimate contractors should accept various forms of payment and provide receipts.

8. Check the Contractor's Past Work

Visit past project sites if possible, or ask for photos of completed work that is similar to what you need. This will give you a sense of the quality and scope of their work.

9. Beware of Too-Good-to-Be-True **Estimates**

Be skeptical of significantly lower estimates than those of other contractors. Scammers often use low bids to lure in clients, only to cut corners or demand more money later.

10. Ask for a Permit

Certain types of construction work re-quire a permit. A legitimate contractor will know the rules and obtain the necessary permits. Verify that the permits are in place before work begins

11. Trust Your Instincts

If something feels off about the contractorwhether it's the way they communicate, their unwillingness to provide infor-mation, or pressure tactics-trust your gut, and consider looking for another contractor.



Each parcel will be offered for sale, subject to a reserve bid and to the reservations and conditions contained in the existing certificate of title.

The Town of Hardisty may, after the public auction, become the owner of any parcel of land not sold at the public auction.

Terms: Any property selling for less than \$25,000 will be considered a "cash sale" and all funds are due and payable via bank draft, certified cheque, VISA, Mastercard, Debit Card, or cash, the day of purchase. Any property selling over \$25,000 will require a minimum of 15% down by way of cash, certified cheque, bank draft, VISA, Mastercard, or Debit Card immediately preceding the purchase that day. A letter of credit must accompany the 15% down from a recognized financial institution for the difference indicating that the buyer has been approved for funding in an amount equal to or greater than the purchase price. Balance of proceeds to be netted in 30 days. All unsightly conditions on these properties will need to be dealt with, within 15 days of the completed purchase at the new owner's expense.

Redemption may be effected by payment of all arrears of taxes and costs at any time prior to the sale.

Let Talk Yards!!!

What do you mean when you send me a letter that says I need to "clean up my yard"?

The town of Hardisty has an unsightly bylaw which indicates what you can and cannot store in your yard. Garbage, piles of tree trimmings, vehicles that are in disrepair, an exceptional number of vehicles, buildings falling etc., are all on the list of what is not allowed. If you are doing a large renovation or doing a major clean up and need help to get your refuse to the transfer station, Flagstaff Waste can temporarily provide you with a dumpster to make your life easier. A quick ok from the town if the dumpster needs to be placed on the street is required, but a simple phone call or email to the office will get the job done.

You can assist the town of Hardisty by doing your best to keep your area neat and tidy. This not only keeps the town presentable to everyone but keeps neighbors and visitors happy to live and visit such a well-kept town.

Why do you send me letters to cut my grass?


In the past a letter has been sent from time to time reminding the owner to mow the lawn. Again, due to the unsightly bylaw, it is the property owner's responsibility to keep their lawn mowed and tidy. What are the expectations? Well, a perfectly manicured lawn is not what we are looking for here, however, lawns need to be tended to every couple of weeks during the summer, sometimes more often when it rains consistently. If a yard is left unkept, the town will mow on their behalf, however the charge to do so is very large. Why is it so high? Because as a town, we do not want to be the "mower for hire" in a town, so making the price extremely high per hour is done to persuade residents to find other means that are more affordable and more accessible.

What happens if I do not comply?

Well, if the town must mow your lawn, there will be \$125.00/hr. charge levied to your utility bill. If the yard is left in disarray, the owners of the property will be subject to a fine or further persecution under the unsightly premises bylaw,

So, what do you do?

The easiest way to avoid receiving a letter of any nature is to do your best to mow your lawn and keep your yard tidy. This year you may be nominated by your neighbor for having a well-kept yard for the incentive that will be awarded in August. Everyone in Hardisty is eligible, so let's make Hardisty shine!
