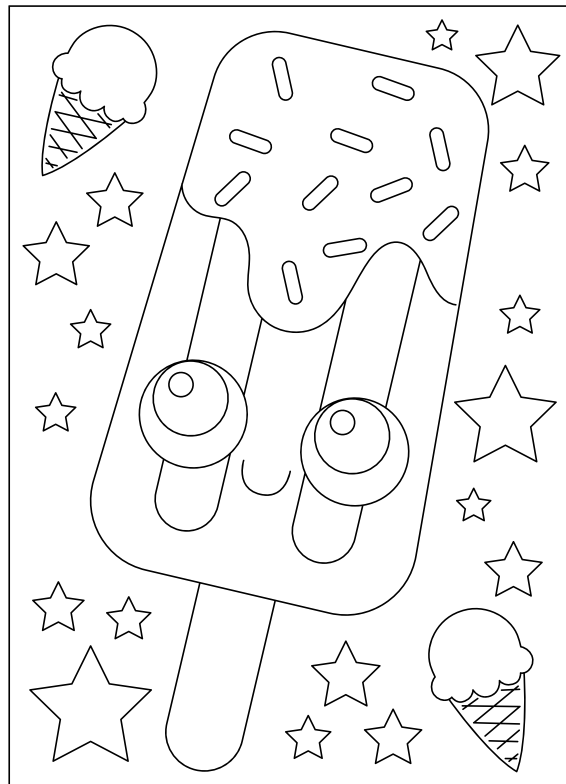
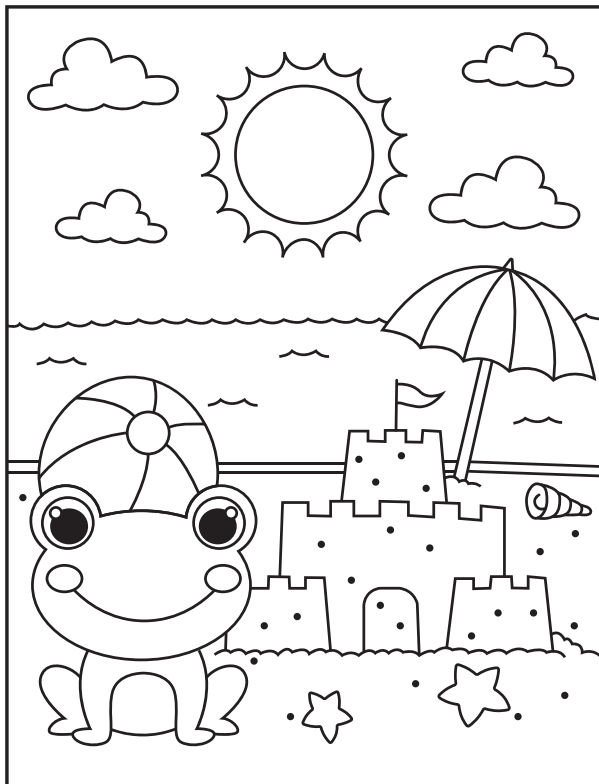

Gibson Energy & Community Members of Maskwacis Raise Tipis in Hardisty

Gibson Energy is proud to announce the purchase and raising of two tipis in the town of Hardisty, as part of our ongoing commitment to reconciliation. The tipis were crafted by the Nations of Maskwacis: Samson Cree Nation, Ermineskin Cree Nation, Louis Bull Tribe, and Montana First Nation. This was not simply a transaction, but a process grounded in respect and collaboration.

The four Nations came together to construct the tipi poles and hand-sew the canvas with care and purpose. The process was guided by ceremonial practices, including smudging and prayer, and carried the shared intention of creating these tipis for Gibson. As traditional homes for many Indigenous peoples, each tipi pole carries a specific teaching and meaning that reflects the values and structure of a strong, guided home.

The tipis, located at Gibson's Control Room and West Terminal, will be seasonally raised in the spring and taken down in early fall. We welcome visitors to experience the tipis but kindly ask if you enter at your own risk and wear appropriate footwear, as the area remains in its natural state.

Gibson is committed to establishing, maintaining and strengthening mutually beneficial relationships with Indigenous peoples and communities in Canada and their respective leadership and communities built on trust, respect and reconciliation. We recognize the deep history and connection that Indigenous Peoples have to the lands where we operate, and we are dedicated to working together in ways that foster understanding, collaboration and shared opportunity.
